

One year later – our clinic has considerably increased the number of surgeries performed!!

It's more than we expected so soon...

With your support, we are well on our way to reaching our goal of doubling the number of surgeries performed at our new clinic, which was purchased just over a year ago. From July 1 through December 1, 2006, our clinic performed just under 2,800 surgeries. For the same time period in 2007, over 4,300 surgeries were performed. In addition several new services were added including microchipping, FELV/FIV testing for cats, along with ear tipping for managed cat colonies.

Each day, our surgical team performs between 50 and 70 surgeries. It can be quite complicated to determine the number, type and sizes of animals our clinic can accommodate each day. We schedule animals based on several factors, including the length of time required to perform surgery and the weight of the animals. We must make sure that an appropriate size cage is available for each animal scheduled. We take into account the differences in the sedation and anesthesia procedures for dogs and cats and the fact that preparing a dog for surgery takes significantly longer than to prepare a cat. The time it takes to actually perform surgery on a female dog or cat is significantly longer than the time taken for a male.

Decreasing the amount of stress each animal feels on their day of surgery is very important to People for Animals. Dogs and cats are kept in separate rooms in individual cages, so that the cats are not upset by the proximity of dogs. Dogs are given a mild sedative upon arrival which keeps them more relaxed while awaiting surgery. In order to minimize discomfort, additional procedures like vaccinations, microchipping and drawing of blood are done after the pet is anesthetized just prior to surgery. All animals, but especially small dogs or cats, puppies and kittens must be carefully kept warm during recovery.

Congratulations to our terrific staff. In the past 6 months, we have added several new employees who have happily joined us in our mission to *significantly lower the number of homeless animals through spay/neuter*. We thank them for their willingness to take on this challenge. Their creativity and the considerable streamlining of many of our processes over the past several months has allowed us to efficiently provide the highest quality care while continuing to take time to give each animal individual monitoring and attention.

My Inspiration.

My beautiful Fred has died.

My story of Fred is a wonderful one of love, perseverance, survivorship, loyalty and more love.

In winter of 1992 I was living with a rescue dog Lucky and a cat,

Jane. I was open to a second rescue dog, and I saw a most pitiful photo of a young dog propped up in a corner showing the line of black stitches from his shoulder down his chest from his recent leg amputation. The caption said he would need very special care and patience. I called People for Animals. When I met him my mind told me to say: "Let me think about it" and get out of there, but I heard myself say: "I think he needs me".

Speaking with a PFA staff member she told me that Fred at first seemed doomed – he was emaciated, covered with mange, front right leg snapped off, back right foot splayed from being pulled from a trap and not treated. They even found a bullet in his side. But none of these injuries were life-threatening and PFA's mission is to save who can be saved. Thank you, from Fred, me and all who came to know him.

So Fred came home with me. The first six months of Freddie sharing our home was anything but boring. He was so paranoid that he wouldn't let anyone else feed him, let him out, touch him. He would just hide under a table or behind something and not come out. He would always make sure he had a visual vantage point so he could see if you were going to try to 'catch' him. You couldn't catch him. He was used to being chased and was the fastest 3-legged dog ever – he was used to running for his life.

Fred was the poster pup for why you should never give up. He became one of the nicest dogs. He took a very long time to warm up to new people but that was okay. I remember a friend saying "He came over to me to say Hi!!" She was so honored that Fred finally trusted and welcomed her. It was a great moment and only took three years of visits.

Fred will always be an inspiration to me – one of overcoming both physical and emotional challenges, that spirit can always grow with love and care, and we can survive and thrive through almost anything. We will miss him but will gratefully remember the 15 ½ years we shared his life.
