

All proceeds will be used exclusively to support our Pet Rescue & Adoption Program that provides medical care, food and shelter for homeless pets. You may attend with or without a dog. It is great fun to see all the dogs and they love the attention. So, if you do

not have a dog to bring, come anyway. The other dogs will be delighted to see you.

Participants may start the Walk any time between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. The Walk is approximately two miles in length. Refreshments will be served. Each dog that attends will receive a Doggie Bag filled with goodies.

Contests for the dogs will be held at 11 a.m. and at 1 p.m. The contest categories are: best trick, best kisser, fastest tail wagger, highest jumper, shortest dog and tallest dog. Dogs may enter any or all contests but may win only one contest. To participate in a contest, a dog must be registered for the Walk.

Every participant who turns in \$75 or more in sponsor donations on the day of the event will receive a free People for Animals tee shirt. There will also be tee shirts and animal-friendly merchandise for sale. In addition, the four participants who turn in the most money in sponsor donations on the day of the event will

President's Message from Martha Sides



A re you sending donations to animal groups that do not share your values? Some rescue groups declaw homeless cats and kittens

before adoption. Some groups euthanize unadoptable homeless dogs or cats in their care. Some nationwide groups advocate mass killing of outside cats. People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) believes that feral cats should be removed and killed rather than trapped, neutered & returned (TNR). The Audubon Society endorses deer hunts and is undergoing a campaign to convince the public that outside cats are dangerous to humans and wildlife, and The American Bird Conservancy and The Wildlife Society both advocate trap and kill. Even the Humane Society of the United States discourages TNR according to the February 2005 newsletter of the New Jersey Animal Rights Alliance (NJARA) in an article entitled "Are Your Donations Killing Feral Cats?"

People for Animals does not believe killing is the solution for any animal problem. There are so many animal welfare groups with different ethics vying for donations. Before you donate, be sure that you agree with those values. Ask questions about the group's policies, ask to see an audited financial statement, ask what percentage of total expenses go to fundraising, ask if the work of the group is supported by foundation grants. Make sure your hard-earned dollars are supporting worthy organizations that agree with your ethics!



2. Clinic hours and fees

Preoperative exams are given on a first come first served basis every Tuesday from 5 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Fees are \$40 for male cats, \$45 for female cats, \$40 to \$65 for dogs depending on sex and weight. Fees include the pre-op exam, rabies and distemper shots, plus the spay/neuter surgery by our experienced licensed veterinarians. Note: pregnant cats and dogs can be spayed.
