The foster person glues these little guys to her and hauls her charges along wherever she goes, sometimes for as long as five weeks to ensure their survival.

#### Inconvenient? Sure. Rewarding? Absolutely.

These four were 'toted' by a PFA volunteer until weaned, then kept for several more weeks before being spayed/neutered and put up for adoption. They are all happy and healthy in their new homes.

At the tender age of 6 weeks, Porky didn't realize the danger he was in – all he wanted to do was play and fool around with his brothers and sisters.
